

A WALK IN THE PARK OF YEARS PAST

In mid-August, a Holt Naturalist sat down with two longtime neighborhood residents, Fran Burkhead and Carolyn Smith, to hear their recollections of the park prior to its donation to Baltimore County in 1974.

"It was all woods," said Fran of the park land. Many of the houses in the area were built during her childhood in the 1940s, but the Holt property remained largely forested. McCormick Avenue and many surrounding roads were still unpaved dirt paths, with no sidewalks or streetlights. At night, the street was said to be "darker than a wolf's mouth." As children, Fran and Carolyn enjoyed playing in the woods near the pond where Lillian's father Tom McCormick had placed a large old-fashioned caravan wagon. There were no paved paths, so they had to cut through the forest to reach it.

Into the 1950s, neighbors to the property helped work on the buildings and grounds. Fran's brothers, then teenagers, assisted with the stonework of the cabin chimneys. "The stone came from several different counties," she said.

In the 1960s, the Waltz family lived in the park and grew daffodils for sale and for donation. Many of those flowers live on, still growing in rows along the "Daffodil Trail" on the east side of the park. The pen adjacent the cabin where they kept their small pony, Sandy, still remains as well.

To the common question, "Is the park haunted?" Fran answered, "My kids growing up thought it was!" Carolyn added, "I think there's something up there. I've heard noises!"

Park naturalists have also heard night-time noises in the park, although these usually turn out to be foxes and squirrels. We suspect you will have to attend the Holt Haunted Hike on October 28th to have a chance at seeing ghosts at Holt Park.
